The role demanded Lee give all of her vulnerability as an actor to this role. This role is one she cannot escape, one with which she will forever be identified. Here was a woman who was not just a victim, but who was owning her sexuality as well—a woman coming into her own and discovering her sources of power. In the wake of the stock market crash and the dawn of the Great Depression, a ray of light emerged from the world of sports in the summer of 1930. Bobby Jones, an amateur golfer who had already won nine of the seventeen major championships he'd entered during the last seven years, mounted his final campaign against the record books. In four months, he conquered the British Amateur Championship, the British Open, the United States Open, and finally the United States Amateur Championship, an achievement so extraordinary that writers dubbed it the Grand Slam. A natural, self-taught player, Jones made his debut at the U.S. Amateur Championship at the age of 14. By the time he completed his unprecedented feat, Bobby Jones was the most famous man not only in golf, but in the history of American sports. Jones followed his crowning achievement with a shocking announcement: his retirement from the game at the age of 28. His abrupt disappearance from the public eye into a closely guarded private life helped create a mythological image of this hero from the Golden Age of sports that endures to this day.

In *Twin Peaks*, California, on a horrible night 40 years ago, a young woman was killed. One life ended, and the life of a young man forever changed. A radio call in the early morning hours reporting a fully involved house fire becomes a firefighter's worst nightmare when he realizes it's his own. His first question is, "Where's Nancy?" Too soon he learns his girlfriend was inside, raped, murdered, and the fire set to destroy evidence. Due to the Sheriff's Department's unwillingness to cross the "Blue Line", it may have remained a "Cold Case" forever had it not been for the stubborn determination of one man over many decades. Cleared of wrong-doing, the author begins his own investigation to find the killer. Alone in his search with a suspect in mind, as rocks are overturned bit by bit, with hints, memories, and facts revealing themselves, Buzz searches for answers and justice. The suspect's family members, the suspect himself, case facts, and other secrets kept over the years help Buzz to discover things that challenge the TV series for strange oddities in a small town. The personal cost is great on every level. Risks are taken, enemies made, memories buried resurface and open old wounds all in honor of the victim's memory and to expose a killer. While formal justice is never found, Karma is served and the limelight is given to the remake of the surreal TV show, *Twin Peaks*, allowing a timely opportunity for revealing the answer to the question: "Who killed Nancy Easton?"

2017 saw the triumphant return of the weird and haunting TV show *Twin Peaks*, with most of the original cast, after a gap of twenty-five years. *Twin Peaks* and *Philosophy* finally answers that puzzling question: What is *Twin Peaks* really about? *Twin Peaks* is about evil in various forms, and poses the question: What 's the worst kind of evil? Can the everyday evil of humans in a small mountain town ever be as evil as the evil of alien supernatural beings? Or is the evil of non-humans actually less threatening because it 's so strange and unaccountable? And does the influence of uncanny forces somehow excuse the crimes committed by regular folks? Some *Twin Peaks* characters try to confine evil by sticking to their own moral code, as in the cast of Albert Rosenfeld, who refuses to disguise his feelings and upsets everyone by his forthright honesty. *Twin Peaks* is about responsibility, both legal and moral. Who is really responsible for the death of Laura Palmer and other murder victims? Although Leland has been revealed as Laura 's actual killer, the show suggests that no one in town was without some responsibility. And was Leland even guilty at all, if he was not in control of his own mind or body? *Twin Peaks* is about the quest for self-knowledge and the dangers of that quest, as Agent Cooper keeps learning something new about himself, as well as about the troubled townspeople. The Buddhist Cooper has to confront his own shadow side, culminating in the rite of passage at the Black Lodge, at the end of Season Two. *Twin Peaks* is about madness, sanity, the borderline between them, and the necessity of some madness to make sense of sanity. The outwardly super-normal if somewhat eccentric Agent Dale Cooper is the inspired, deranged, and dedicated shaman who seeks the truth by coming to terms with the reality of unreason, partly through his dreams and partly through his existential encounters with giants, logs, outer space, and other unexpected sources. Cooper challenges official law enforcement 's over-reliance on science. *Twin Peaks* is about the imagination run wild, moving from metaphysics to pataphysics—the discipline invented by Alfred Jarry, which probes the assumption that anything can happen and discovers the laws governing events which constitute exceptions to all laws.
